Matthew 20:1-16

When he entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him as he was teaching, and said, 'By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?' 24 Jesus said to them, 'I will also ask you one question; if you tell me the answer, then I will also tell you by what authority I do these things. ²⁵Did the baptism of John come from heaven, or was it of human origin?' And they argued with one another, 'If we say, "From heaven", he will say to us, "Why then did you not believe him?" ²⁶But if we say, "Of human origin", we are afraid of the crowd; for all regard John as a prophet.' ²⁷So they answered Jesus, 'We do not know.' And he said to them, 'Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things.

²⁸ 'What do you think? A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, "Son, go and work in the vineyard today." ²⁹He answered, "I will not"; but later he changed his mind and went. ³⁰The father went to the second and said the same; and he answered, "I go, sir"; but he did not go. 31Which of the two did the will of his father?' They said, 'The first.' Jesus said to them, 'Truly I tell you, the tax-collectors and the prostitutes are going into the kingdom of God ahead of you. 32For John came to you in the way of righteousness and you did not believe him, but the tax-collectors and the prostitutes believed him; and even after you saw it, you did not change your minds and believe him.

The Address:

I was going to talk to you about another subject I'd prepared, but then I changed my mind! Changing our mind is actually a uniquely human thing to do. Borris Johnston seems to have changed his mind on the withdrawal agreement with the EU. A virus expert from Sweeden who was advocating herd immunity to Ireland on Wednesday, has since 'changed his mind'. People can get cold feet before a wedding and 'change their mind'. It really is a very important part of our human decision making and a freedom we can employ.

In today's gospel reading Jesus tells of two sons, in which at least one of them changed their mind. The father in the parable approaches them for help in his vineyard. The first son says he would help- but then doesn't. Perhaps he never intended to. The other said he wouldn't help, but then changes his mind, and does the work in the vineyard. Jesus then asks the question, which son did his father's will. He was making the point that lip service is of little value. Actions speak louder than words. Many of us in the church could be guilty of mere lip service. We have promised to follow Jesus at our baptism and confirmation. But then, did we change our mind? Which son are we most like? Can we change our mind to be more like the second son?

Paul urges the believers in our epistle reading today— "be of the same mind, having the same love, ...3Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves." Philippians 2:2-3

Can you imagine a world where this was true among humans? No selfish ambition, and a longing to see others flourish. Is this possible? Paul says 'yes', and draws us back to Jesus: ⁵Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus...' and then quotes a lovely

hymn that celebrates Jesus' humility, self-emptying, and ultimate exultation.

In our world we see many examples of 'absolute power corrupting absolutely'. But Jesus is the complete opposite of this. Out of obedience to his Father's will, he emptied himself, taking the form of a servant and became obedient to death, even death on a cross. It's back to the *Slí na Croise*, 'the way of the cross'. A way of humility that leads to everlasting joy. How do we get this mind of humility?

It's JOY:

J- Jesus first- 'What would Jesus do?' in this and every situation you face.

O- others next- no selfish ambition but a desire to see others flourish.

Y- yourself last- positively loving yourself.

So let's make JOY our mindset. Let's avoid mere lip service to God but rather engage in working in his vineyard. Let's change a selfish ambition mindset to something life-giving and that leads to JOY.

Jesus- What would he do? Others, how can I help? Yourself- making sure your needs are met too. May the mind of Christ flourish among us. So, if we change our mind about something today, may we change our mind to the mind of Christ. Amen.
